

Paronomasia:

Wordplay of the punning kind, i.e., using similar-sounding (or identical-sounding) words with different meanings in close proximity to each other, for an effect of comedy, balance, or cleverness.

Pangrammaton:

Sentences that have every letter of the alphabet

Examples:

“John P. Brady, gave me a black walnut-box of quite a small size.”

“The quick brown fox jumped over the lazy dog’s back.”

Names in the past tense:

Doug

Ran

Drew

Homonym -same sound, often same spelling, different meaning

Homograph -same spelling, different meaning, sometimes different pronunciation

Homophone -same sound, different meaning, origin, and sometimes spelling
